<b>Parent and Family Concerns</b> (Question 1)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>At least 17% (2/12) of parents had a concern about their child’s learning, development, or behavior</li> <li>8% (1/12) of parents had a concern about how their child uses his or her hands and fingers</li> <li>17% (2/12) of parents had a concern about how their child uses his or her arms and legs</li> <li>8% (1/12) of parents had a concern about how their child makes sounds</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>9% (1/11) of parents had a concern about their child’s learning, development, or behavior</li> <li>9% (1/11) of parents had a concern about how their child talks and makes speech sounds</li> <li>9% of parents had a concern about how their child behaves</li> <li>9% (1/11) of parents had a concern about their child’s moods and emotions</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>8% (1/12) of parents had a concern about their child’s learning, development, or behavior</li> <li>17% (2/12) of parents had a concern about how their child behaves</li> <li>8% (1/12) of parents had a concern about how their child gets along with others</li> <li>25% (3/12) of parents had a concern about their child’s mood and emotions</li> </ul>
<b>Provider-Patient Discussions</b> (Question 2)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Of the parents that did not have specific questions to discuss with the provider about their child in the following topic areas, 17% (2/12) wish they had talked about expected behaviors as their child gets older, 17% wish they had talked about night waking and fussing, 8% (1/12) wish they had talked about what their child is able to understand, and 8% (1/12) wish they had talked about parent/family resources in the community</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>9% (1/11) of parents had a question about their child’s moods and emotions, but their questions were not completely answered</li> <li>9% (1/11) did not have any specific questions to discuss with the provider but wish that they had talked about parent/family resources in the community</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>One parent (1/12) did not have any specific questions to discuss with the provider but wishes that they had talked about parent/family resources in the community</li> </ul>
<b>Experience of Care</b> (Questions 3, 4, 5, 6 & 7)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All parents reported that at the surveyed visit, their provider <i>usually</i> or <i>always</i> treated the parent as an expert about their child, was courteous and respectful, explained things well and took time to understand the needs of the child</li> <li>75% (9/12) of parents reported being asked by the provider if they had concerns about their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>75% (9/12) were given specific information to address concerns, 25% (3/12) did not have any concerns at the time of the visit</li> <li>25% (3/12) of parents reported that their child’s provider tested their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>36% (4/11) of parents reported that their child’s provider had them fill out a questionnaire about concerns or observations about their child</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All parents reported that at the surveyed visit, their provider <i>usually</i> or <i>always</i> treated the parent as an expert about their child, was courteous and respectful, explained things well and took time to understand the needs of the child</li> <li>82% (9/11) of parents reported being asked by the provider if they had concerns about their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>36% (4/11) were given specific information to address concerns, 64% (7/11) did not have any concerns at the time of the visit</li> <li>27% (3/11) of parents reported that their child’s provider tested their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>73% (8/11) of parents reported that their child’s provider had them fill out a questionnaire about concerns or observations about their child</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>All parents reported that at the surveyed visit, their provider <i>usually</i> or <i>always</i> treated the parent as an expert about their child, was courteous and respectful, explained things well and took time to understand the needs of the child</li> <li>92% (11/12) of parents reported being asked by the provider if they had concerns about their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>42% (5/12) were given specific information to address concerns, 58% (7/12) did not have any concerns at the time of the visit</li> <li>50% (6/12) of parents reported that their child’s provider tested their child’s learning, development or behavior</li> <li>67% (8/12) of parents reported that their child’s provider had them fill out a questionnaire about concerns or observations about their child</li> </ul>
