CO	At DOC's central office; also Denver County jail	Prior to release	-Correctional facility case managers obtain signed permission forms from individuals which are sent to DOC central office -Nurse case managers at DOC central office complete applications -For Denver jail, Denver Department of Human Services staff assist with completing paperwork	-2 nurse case managers at DOC central office complete and process applications electronically after receiving permission forms from facilities; data sent to Department of Health Care Policy and Financing -For Denver jail, applications submitted on day of release	-Yes, generally; if not, then individuals are provided w/their Medicaid number and DOC nurse case manager phone number -For Denver jail, generally no because applications are submitted on the day of release
IL	Enrollment education provided in correctional facilities; enrollment at various jails across the state and through the reentry process	At intake in Cook County jail; prior to release in other jails and during reentry for the correctional population	Primarily ACA in-person assisters or Certified Application Counselors	In-person assister submits applications and applications are processed by state Medicaid agency	No; eligibility results, paperwork and Medicaid cards are mailed to individuals' addresses upon release
NM	In state prisons, two county jails and two state and county juvenile detention centers	Prior to release	Corrections staff trained as presumptive eligibility (PE) determiners by Human Services Department	All Medicaid applications filed by incarcerated individuals are processed by the Medical Assistance Division's PE Applications Processing Unit	No; individuals are provided w/their Medicaid number and MCO contact numbers
OH	In correctional facilities; prisons	90-120 days prior to release, individuals can attend classes led by peer educators to learn about enrollment process	-Individuals complete forms and begin application process via phone; peer educators can assist -Each facility has a liaison who selects the peer educators and assists with overall process	-Telephone call is to select managed care plan -Enrollment is completed when corrections department sends information to the Medicaid portal for an eligibility screen	-Yes; and Medicaid information included on release paperwork -Individuals with two or more risk factors have transition plans
RI	In correctional facilities (state has a unified prison/jail system)	Prior to release, individuals are provided information and paper applications at group education classes	-Brown University interns provide application assistance -Other assisters at probation offices/exit resource centers help individuals enroll	Paper applications are hand carried by corrections staff to Medicaid agency	No; eligibility determination is conducted after individual is released from incarceration
WA	In correctional facilities; mostly prisons, some larger jails	90 days prior to release information is provided to individuals; 45-60 days prior to release applications are provided	Trained staff at the correctional facilities assist individuals with completing the application	-Applications are scanned and sent to central office (DOC) -Information is entered into system 30 days prior to release	Yes, generally
WI	In correctional facilities; mostly in prisons	Individuals with release dates can apply via phone on or after the 20 th day of the month prior to the month of release	-Social workers facilitate calls for individuals facing challenges to successful application -ACA "site coordinators" at correctional facilities help with overall process	Through telephonic application process, which includes a telephonic signature	Yes, generally
