JEAN

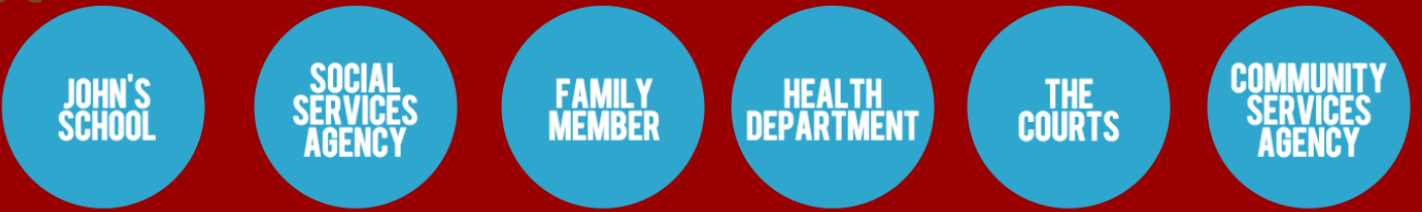


Thirty-five-year-old single mom Jean works a part-time, minimum wage job and has numerous health issues including uncontrolled diabetes and a history of depression and substance abuse. Her seven-year-old son John has asthma and suffers from emotional and behavioral problems. Jean and John rely on a number of state agencies and programs to assist them. Given the complex and uncoordinated system of referrals along with the differences in agency eligibility requirements, funding sources, and waiting lists they are left with referrals to agencies that do not have the funds to deliver the needed services.

1. Jean and John are referred to the Virginia Children's Services Act (CSA) by:



2. CSA's Local Family Assessment & Planning Team (FAPT) works with Jean and John to develop one individualized plan of services.



3. A case manager helps Jean and John obtain the services in the FAPT's plan, which are paid for by the Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT) from a variety of sources.
