	The first ABCD Consortium (ABCD I) was created in 2000 and featured four states. In the last 13 years there have been three more ABCD initiatives (ABCD II, Screening Academy, ABCD III), which have involved 25 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Neva Kaye from NASHP and Melinda Abrams from The Commonwealth Fund have both been involved with the initiative since its inception. During this section Ms. Kaye and Ms. Abrams will comment on the legacy of ABCD.
