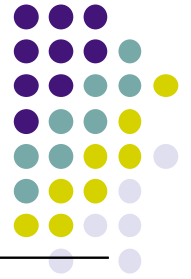

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- To strengthen states' capacity to deliver care that supports young children's healthy development
  - Oriented toward preventive care and early identification
  - Policy and systems improvement at the state level
  - Quality improvement at the primary care practice and community level

# ABCD III

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- Care coordination
  - Communication and linkages among primary care and community service providers
  - Referral and follow up information
- Three-year learning collaborative: Arkansas, Illinois, Minnesota, Oklahoma and Oregon
- Piloted and evaluated strategies to improve care coordination
  - Provider, plan, community, and state systems levels
